Surface: 10 000 hectares, stretch over 51 villages

Appellation: Côtes du Ventoux

Soil: Chalky soil with reef and pebble stones .

Grappes: grenache, carignan and cinsault principalement.

Harvest: mechanical

History

Mais ce sont les Romains qui les premiers vont réellement développer la culture de la vigne sur les coteaux du Mont-Ventoux



Soil

The Côtes du Ventoux, located on the slopes of Mont Ventoux, stretch over 51 villages between Vaison La Romaine in the north and Apt in the south.

The Mont Ventoux, called « giant of Provence » is the highest mountains of France with the 1912 m.



Wine

Color: This wine has a ruby color with a high intensity.

Nose: The Syrah brings aromas of red fruits, redcurrant and blackberry.

Mouth: A fruity wine with a good structure. The Grenache grape gives elegance and finesse.



Service

Ready to drink in order to appreciate the fine fruity taste but can be kept 2 to 3 years.

It is an elegant companion to salad, plate of assorted cooked meat, grilled and red meat.

Service: Serve it between 12 and 14°C.
